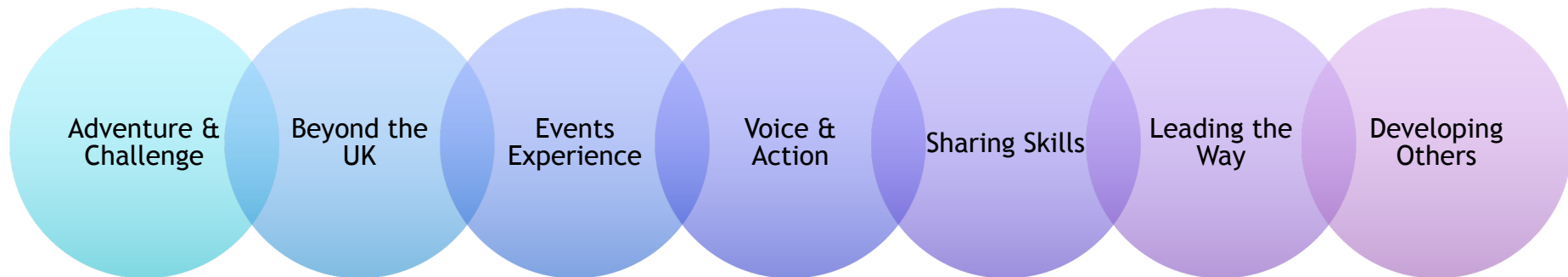

Sharing Skills

We know that many young women want to share their skills to support the development of younger girls, but it needs to fit with your other commitments.

So we're creating new volunteering roles which are more flexible and don't require you to be attached to a unit or to have completed your Leadership qualification first such as county skills pools or holiday guiding.



There are lots of ways to stay involved in Guiding that don't require you to be at a unit meeting every week. What time do you want to give? What can you realistically fit in? The world has changed and so much of what we do has changed with it. There will be a role for you, if you want it.

Leading the Way

Becoming a unit leader - or volunteering as part of a unit team - is an incredibly rewarding experience. It's a great way to build your leadership skills while inspiring the next generation of girls, giving them amazing experiences and confidence. You could also choose to apply your skills to working with adults or as a commissioner supporting other volunteers.

Developing Others

If you enjoy helping others to develop their own skills and knowledge, you could work with younger girls through our peer education programme. Or you might be a mentor or trainer to adults. Whatever you decide to do, you'll play a crucial part in making guiding the best it can be. All while building skills and experience to facilitate meetings and deliver training.
