The following checklist could be useful when visiting a unit. Use it as a guide to what you should be looking for.

Things to look for:	Comments	
Is everyone participating in what is going on?		
Are all the Leaders involved?(Remember that		
chatting to the girls is very much an important		
part of Guiding.) Are all the girls occupied? Is		
anyone left out?		
Are the girls working in small groups and		
helping each other? How are individual needs		
met?		
Is there variety in the evening/term		
programme? How have the girls been involved		
in choosing what to do? Remember there is		
nothing wrong with the adults choosing and		
leading some activities, especially depending		
on the age group, but the girls should help plan		
at least some of the programme.		
Does the unit use appropriate Guiding		
resources? Do the girls know what is available		
to them?		
What does the unit do outside the regular		
meetings? Have the girls had the opportunity to		
go on a residential event in the last year?		
Does the unit ever join up with another unit for		
a meeting, outing, sleepover and so on?		
How are the older girls supported and how are		
they encouraged to move on to the next		
section?		
What records are available at the meeting? Do		
all Leaders know where they are?		
Is the meeting place suitable and safe?		
How do the Leaders ensure behaviour		
standards? Is the level of discipline appropriate?		
How do the Leaders keep their skills and		
knowledge of good Guiding up to date? Are they		
aware of training opportunities available to		
them?		

Always remember to provide feedback at the end of your visit, or arrange for a time to talk over the visit with the Leaders. Remember to keep any feedback constructive and provide reasons for your views. Every unit is different and it is important to welcome and value diversity.
